



Senior Bishop Visits Nashville, TN



(April 27, 28, 29, 2007)

Nashville - Renewed! Restored! Revived!

Bishop Faye Moore has a heart for the people of God in every city, and to prove it, she arranged for two traveling evangelists to spend an entire week, witnessing and ministering to the saints and any other soul they came in contact with in the city of Nashville, TN.

The healing of the sick, hurt and discouraged began on Sunday, April 22nd and climaxed on Sunday, April 29th. Elder Faye Coney and Elder Emma Jean Morrow set the city of Nashville on fire. The first Sunday they were there, three young men joined the church – Praise the Lord! They were styled as “Joshua and Caleb” in the Bible.

The weekend revival there began on Friday night, at the beautiful Millennium Maxwell House Hotel. Following are events and highlights from the 3-day revival:

Friday night, Pastor Ollie Jennings opened the services with renewed enthusiasm. She testified of how thankful and grateful she and her members were to have these two traveling evangelists work in her area. She was inspired to work as never before. The worship and praise team led out with songs of adoration and worship to God, which ended with a glorious hymn. Old fashioned testimony services caused the saints to rejoice under the power of the Holy Ghost.

Reverend Sara Covington of the New Jersey Mission preached a power sermon from Psalms 84:11, “*No Good Thing Will The Lord Withhold from Them That Walk Upright!*”

Then, Reverend Joyce Flemmings of Toccopola, MS spoke a word from Psalms 27:14, “*Wait on the Lord, and Be of Good Courage*”. The altar call was powerful – Bishop Joseph Taylor compelled men to come to the altar to renew their relationships with the Lord, because death could overtake us at any moment. He encouraged the people to be ready.

To top everything off, Bishop Faye Moore sang “Just One More Time – I’m Glad to be in Your Presence One More Time”. Following that she requested Bishop Worthem to read from Psalms 51:10 (*...renew in me the right spirit*) and Psalms 27:4 (*I desire to dwell in the House of the Lord all the days of my life*). The saints were encouraged by the words of our Leader, with love and hope for a bright future.

On Saturday afternoon, Bishop Moore had an opportunity to visit the grave site of our founder, Mother M. L. Tate. It was a very touching moment for our Leader.

Saturday night brought another moving service for the people of God. The opening prayer coming from Bishop Martha Flemons, was very powerful. Worship and Praise followed, with a glorious hymn and testimony service. Bishop Joseph Taylor of Owensboro, KY was used by God through his power-packed testimony and exhortation to the ministers of the Church. He challenged the ministers to get up and go to work – get busy for the Lord. Bishop Corroneva Burns confirmed the message given in his testimony. The saints praised God in the dance!

A short program was conducted by Chief Helper, Bishop Calvin Worthem. The three participants were: Brother and Sister John Randle of Amory, MS; Sister Candace Buchanan of Mt. Clemens, MI; and Ishmael Boles and his sisters of Nashville, TN. After these anointed psalmists sang, tears of joy streamed from the eyes of our Leader, for truly the Lord’s presence could be felt in the room. God spoke through the testimonies and the songs, therefore, the preach list was eliminated for the night. God’s work was done!

Closing remarks from Bishop Moore included the reading of the following scriptures: Acts 16:9 and Nehemiah 6: 2 & 12. Bishop Moore answered the call for help coming from the saints in Nashville, like the Lord did in the days of old for His people.

The last session of the Revival was glorious! The psalmists were: Deacon Charles Pettigrew, Elder Rosette Coney, and Reverend Angie Traylor. The Lord used Bishop Moore mightily as she ministered the word and the offertory services together (*from the books of Haggai and Zechariah*). She wanted to bless Nashville and give them a great boost in building a place of worship. She asked for **and** received volunteers who were willing to sacrifice their time and strength to help with this building project. Nashville members and all others in attendance received a special anointing of oil from our Leader! Praise God for this Revival!
